

THE CONTRACT STORYBOOK

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In class, we have now learned that a legally enforceable contract must contain all 6 elements: Offer, Acceptance, Genuine Agreement, Consideration, Capacity and Legality. There are certain conditions that might make for a contract to be void, voidable or unenforceable.

Task:

For this project, you and a partner, will be assigned a set of characters and a characteristic of a contract, for example: valid, void, voidable or unenforceable. Using what you have learned to this point in the class, you are to create a children's storybook demonstrating how a contract may or may not come into existence.

You will have 2 days to create a storyboard using the attached sheets and then you will have 3 days in the computer lab to create a storybook in google slides.

Requirements:

- Create a catchy title for your book
- Each page should contain only one or two sentences
- Each page must contain a picture which relates to your story theme
- The final page of your presentation must be your "Moral of the Story". Explain if your contract is valid, void, voidable or unenforceable.
- Since this is a partnered assignment, both of you will need to speak in front of the class
- The final project is due 5 days from the start date, no excuses. We are using Google Slides and each partner can collaborate from anywhere.

Grading:

- Clear examples of each element of the contract.
- Grammar, spelling and punctuation.
- Visuals that relate to the story
- A clear moral to your story.
- Collaboration (each partner contributes equally to the slide presentation)
- Presentation (extra points for dressing as your characters)
